## About human trafficking

Human trafficking involves the act of recruiting, transporting, transferring, harbouring or receiving a person through a use of force, deception or other means for the purpose of exploiting them. Every year, thousands of children, women and men fall into the hands of traffickers due to lack of awareness, poverty, harmful societal norms, lack of economic opportunities and high demand for girls.

### End-to-end casework

We adopt end-to-end casework, focusing on individuals, families and communities vulnerable to or affected by the crime of trafficking. It encompasses prevention, rescue, prosecution, rehabilitation and reintegration.

### Multi-disciplinary

Our multi-disciplinary unit brings together social workers, case workers, lawyers, researchers and community development professionals throughout the survivor life-cycle, ensuring holistic effective solutions.

### Building networks

We collaborate with a network of stakeholders such as police officials, community-based organisations, corporates, foundations and activists to generate awareness, build capacity and achieve lasting impact.

### Evidence generation

We assess internal and external data sets to build scientific evidence; analyse and examine data sets to understand the situation of trafficking and existing gaps, loopholes and good practices.
